

NIMHANS Digital Academy Diploma in "Community Mental Health" for Doctors

Course Overview: Diploma in Community Mental Health is specially designed for Medical Officers working at Taluk and District and Taluk level Government Hospitals in various parts of the country. This course is designed to provide a basic understanding of the various common Mental conditions and their effective management. This is also suitable for those doctors who are willing to upscale themselves to handle any criticalities related to mental health issues The course covers the basic concepts, practices and the translation of knowledge into clinical practice.

Course Objectives: On course completion, the participants should be able to:

- A. Identify, screen for mental health disorders (CMD, SUD and SMD) and factors influencing it
 - B. Decide "best practices" like pharmacological treatment and handle brief psychosocial interventions for mental health issues.

C. Make decisions about what can be managed by them and what needs to be referred to higher centres

(CMD: Common Mental Disorders, SUD: Substance use disorders (Alcohol and Nicotine), SMD: Severe Mental Disorders (Psychosis)).

At the end of this course the Medical officer will be able to

- Evaluate the common psychiatric conditions like Anxiety, Depression, Suicide, Alcohol and Nicotine addiction, Psychosis, Sleep and Sexual problems

- Understand the biopsychosocial model of disorders
- Evaluate the management options for the above conditions
- Use effective and evidence based pharmacotherapy
- Understand the side effects of medications
- Perform Brief Psychosocial interventions

Duration of course: This is a blended learning digital certificate course of three months

duration. Course will consist of four Self-paced learning

modules and six interactive VKN discussions.

Teaching Methodology

This will be a blended learning method -

Self-paced e-learning (Anytime) + Face to face interactive Virtual sessions through VKN NIMHANS ECHO (Real Time) supported by Audience response system (sli.do) + WhatsApp educational group.

Self-paced E-learning (Google Classroom app or webpage)

Each participant will have access to a Learning Management Solution (example: Google classroom app or Talent LMS similar webpage). The relevant contents will be delivered through this app. These will be in the form of recorded video, selected text book, articles, videos, powerpoints etc. They have access to this for life long. They can interact with the trainers also.

Interactive VKN tele-sessions

This will happen by using VKN NIMHANS ECHO multipoint video conferencing platform every fortnight. This can be accessible through any smartphone, tablet, desktop or laptop. The medical officers can join from their workplace twice a month during a fixed time. The focus here is

- 1. Patient centric discussion or demonstration
- 2. Clarification of doubts
- 3. Brief Didactic lecture by NIMHANS faculty on specific areas.

Zoom cloud video conferencing software will be used. Link will be provided for free download from the web.

"Super Friday": e-Consultation with Spoke Participants

On every Friday, from 9:30am to 4:30pm, all the Specialist team leads are made available for consultation or clarification of difficult cases by the spoke participants on one to one basis. They can connect to any of our specialists and ask queries through phone call, whatsapp message or can get the patient online (if required with patient's consent) for interviewing the patient and clarifying the diagnosis using zoom app. Following this, the management plan will be sent to the particular spoke through whatsapp message or email for immediate execution to the patient. These cases are also presented in subsequent tele-ECHO session for peer based learning by the spokes.

What is the Eligibility Criteria?

MBBS graduates registered with Medical Council of India (MCI) or any of the state medical councils working at District or Taluk level

Is it recognized ?


Yes. Board of studies (BOS) of NIMHANS, a statutory body and Institute of National Importance India (like MCI) has approved this course.

The list of successful candidates will be displayed in the website of Virtual Knowledge Network, NIMHANS as well as Ministry of Health and Family welfare, India.

What are the criteria for successful completion of the course? (of three months)

The following criteria are to be fulfilled to be eligible for the award of Certificate.

More than 80% completion of the Self-paced digital learning module (as measured by the software) + Minimum one case discussion in the fortnightly Tele-ECHO VKN sessions (as measured by the software and your video presence) + > 80% in the final assignment to be held on a fixed date and time for one hour in a videoconferencing mode. Assignments will be problem based clinically relevant case scenarios, multiple answer questions, short notes etc. Monthly reports of the patients seen, completion of pre-test and periodic surveys etc are part of the course.



What is the course fee?

There is no fee for accessing the self-paced learning material and going through the same. If you want to opt for Certification then a nominal fee of 5000 INR need to be paid after enrollment. This fee is non-refundable.

Monitoring & Evaluation

Medical officers

Moore's evaluation framework $(2015)^1$ for continuing medical education (CME) has been regularly used to assess the outcomes.

1. Level one: Participation

The number of healthcare professionals, who participated in the activity

2. Level two: Satisfaction

The degree to which the expectations of the participants about the setting and delivery of the activity were met

3. Level three: Learning

The degree to which participants could demonstrate that they know what the program intended them to be able to do (declarative and procedural knowledge)

4. Level four: Competence

The degree to which participants could show in an educational setting how to do what the activity intended them to be able to do (perceived self-efficacy/self-confidence)

5. Level five: Performance

The degree to which participants could do what the activity intended them to do in their practices.
